### Scholarships:

**Please apply by letter of application/intent to the Chair.** Rolling deadline, but please let Professor Welch know about your plans no later than **April 11**.

<b>Classics Study Abroad Scholarships</b>	For majors and graduate students in Classics participating in appropriate programs abroad involving Classics. Statement of purpose (100-200 words) and the name of one reference in the Classics Department required.
<b>Merit + Need Scholarships</b>	One-time awards for extraordinary circumstances. <b>You may also apply when needed.</b>
<b>Tenney Frank Incoming Student Scholarships</b>	Recruiting awards for new 1 <sup>st</sup> -year and transfer students. Two letters of recommendation are required.
<b>Oliver C. Phillips Scholarship</b>	For students intent on teaching Latin at any level. Two letters of Recommendation are required for the application.
<b>Michael Shaw Scholarship</b>	For students attending programs at the American School of Classical Studies at Athens. The name of one reference in the Classics Department is required.
<b>Prizes and Honors:</b>

<b>Hannah Oliver Latin Prize</b>	Handicapped competitive exam open to undergraduate majors. See flyer. <b>Offered the week of April 20.</b>
<b>Graduate Student Latin Prize</b>	Handicapped competitive exam open to graduate students. See flyer. <b>Offered the week of April 20.</b>
<b>Sterling Walker Prize in Greek</b>	Handicapped competitive exam, for any student (graduate or undergraduate) enrolled in a Greek course. See flyer. <b>Offered the week of April 20.</b>
<b>Albert O. Greef Prize</b>	For a polished, literary translation of a passage of Greek or Latin. Open to any student enrolled in a Latin or Greek course. Students can compete in both Greek and Latin. See flyer. <b>Deadline April 24.</b>
<b>Mildred Lord Greef Prize</b>	For outstanding written work (papers, essays) in a Latin, Greek, or Classics course, spring 2019 to spring 2020. All students are eligible; thesis chapters are not eligible. See flyer. <b>Deadline April 24.</b>

To keep in mind for next year: We offer **Conference or Academic Travel Scholarships** to present a paper at a conference in the field. In general, this funding is available only to students who have exhausted other funding opportunities at KU. Rolling deadline in Classics; but please be aware of early deadlines at the College or University level.
